The Kamuela Philharmonic Orchestra opens its 13 season with "Triumph and Desire" at 4 p.m. Sunday at Kahilu Theatre in Waimea.

The orchestra, led by Maestro

Brian Dollinger, will perform the orchestral masterpiece Symphony No. 5 in E minor, op. 64 by Pyotr Ilyich Tchaikovsky, which has come to symbolize the composer's triumph over difficult circumstances. Rounding out the program are the Fanfare La Peri by Paul Dukas, Adagio from Spartacus

by Aram Khachaturian, and Suite No. 1 from Carmen by Georges Bizet — musical selections that illustrate the power of love and desire.

Dollinger has brought a concert experience to Hawaii Island that is not only relaxed and family friendly but true to the very nature of great symphonic

performances. Each performance includes popular and well-known melodies or entire works that every audience member is sure to recognize.

The concert will begin with a boisterous welcome to the new concert

ARTIST CINDY COATS UNVEILS ANNUAL IRONMAN WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP PAINTING

Hawaii Island resident and artist Cindy Coats recently debuted her ninth annual Ironman World Championship painting, commemorating the endurance event set here on Hawaii Island on Saturday.

The new, original piece for Kona's iconic event is titled "Celebrate the Dream," and incorporates "street art."

"I'm surrounded by beauty and inspiration here on Hawaii Island," Coats, a 21-year resident of Holualoa, said. "When I moved the gallery to its current location in 2008 creating an Ironman-themed

you meet ... athletes, trainers, family and friends. Everyone has a different reason for being here. It's awe-inspiring."

Each year, this event supporter challenges herself to come up with something completely new to celebrate the relationship between Ironman, the athletes and our

community, according to her many collectors and fans.

Holualoa author pens crime novel

"Badge, Bullets and Blood," a new book by Holualoa author Henry (Hank) J. Silva, was recently released by Dorrance Publishing Co. Detectives Bobby Olivares and Brent Olson work as partners for the Hawaiian Police Department. Dedicated to solving crimes, upholding the law, and saving citizens, these two find creative ways to make sure justice is served. Sometimes those solutions aren't always approved by the higher ups, until the cases are cracked wide open and the public is safe again. Confronted with a murderer who preys on innocent young girls, the two men must use everything in their power to catch him. Just when they think the streets are

safe again, they stumble onto a case bigger than either of them could ever imagine. With the Mexican Mafia and Middle Eastern terrorists threatening their lives and Hawaiian citizens, Olivares and Olson have to pull out all of the stops to right the wrongs, punish the bad guys, and restore justice and get in a few gunfights along the way. Silva was born on Oahu three months before the Pearl Harbor attack on Dec. 7, 1941. He obtained a college degree in criminal justice and followed a police career as his grandfather before him when he became a police officer in 1966. After retirement, he worked for the federal government and owned Ex-Cop Investigations. He also worked as a reserve officer for 18 years and for his last five years, he investigated cold case homicides. The author lives with his wife of and their rottweiler,

"Bullet." This is the Silva's second novel with the first being "The Badge, The Balls and The Bull Sh-t." The 230-page book retails for \$17. Info: Visit www.bookstore.dorrancepublishing.com.

A Japanese Kitchen hits stores

Muriel Miura recently released "A Japanese Kitchen," a 272-page hardcover book featuring 170 recipes based upon her family's treasure of favorites. Mirua's niche is Japanese cooking, Hawaii-style, and her guiding philosophy has always been that preparing food should be approachable, fun and family centered. She has shared her knowledge for more than five decades via classes, TV shows, and more than 20 books. The book explores the essence of Japanese

cooking, from zensai (appetizers) to okashi (desserts). There are many centuries-old recipes updated and Westernized to meet today's tastes and lifestyles, and others that more clearly reflect the 150-year legacy of the Japanese in Hawaii. "A Japanese Kitchen" is extensively illustrated, and includes detailed background information, cultural insights, and family vignettes, as well as ingredient and recipe indexes, a glossary, and essays on Japanese traditions and celebrations. season with a performance of Dukas's fanfare from his ballet La Peri. Dukas is a composer every listener will know as his music was utilized for the iconic Mickey Mouse cartoon in Disney's Fantasia — The Sorcerer's Apprentice. This fanfare will be the perfect start to this performance. The orchestra will then bring to life some of the most memorable melodies from the opera Carmen by Bizet. Two of the most beloved and recognizable arias in all of the operatic literature — Habenera and Toreador — are featured in this multi-movement work. Bizet's opera has received much

acclaim for the skill with which it displays the emotions and sufferings of its characters. After his death, Bizet's friend, Ernest Guiraud, compiled the two multi-movement suites of music drawn from this opera. Khachaturian, a Soviet Armenian composer and conductor, was the author of the first Armenian symphony, as well as concerti, ballet music, and film scores. He is best known for the music he composed for the ballets, Gayane and Spartacus. The ballet score to Spartacus, with its lively rhythms and strong energy, aptly dramatizes the struggles of Spartacus and his wife, but it is the heartfelt Adagio, which the KPO will be presenting in this performance, a love theme which has been used in several films, which

has come to symbolize their undying devotion despite any obstacles. The finale of Triumph and Desire will be the fateful and triumphant Symphony No. 5 by Tchaikovsky. Tchaikovsky's talent was recognized from an early age, and despite his financial and artistic struggles, anxiety over homosexual tendencies (punishable by death in his time), and a disastrous marriage, with the help of wealthy admirers, he managed to become a very successful teacher, music critic, and composer. The sponsorship of Tsar Alexander I led to the widespread popularity of Tchaikovsky's compositions, including the 1812 Overture and the opera Eugene Onegin, both in Russia and abroad. His ballets, including Swan Lake,

The Sleeping Beauty, and The Nutcracker became audience favorites and set new standards for the role of music in classical ballet. When his fame as a composer grew outside of Russia, Tchaikovsky conquered lifelong stage fright to become a sought-after international guest conductor. He used his fame to promote Russian music, introducing his own works and those of other Russian composers to wider audiences.
